# Virtual Wine Tastings

Continue to reach your clients online with Bottlebooks







Virtual tastings are your chance to talk about your wines without meeting in person



### What to talk about

This is your expertise. You do not need to over plan or over think your topics.

Talk about your new vintage or ranges.

Be able to answer questions about availability.



## What about tasting the wines?

Depending on conditions in your country, you can ship samples beforehand or, if possible, provide a link to buy the wine locally.

Likely you will be talking to those who already love your wines. If they don't have the new vintage, they will still want to hear you talk about it.

Ensure that you provide some bullet points and a link to the video after for their reference later.



### Technology

Tastings can be done from your phone or laptop. It does not take high level of technical knowledge to do so.

In the following slides there are a list of technologies to use with a guide to get you started.

If the tasting is and open invitation use the social community you use most whether it be Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, or YouTube. For invitation only, Skype or Zoom might be better options.





Go to <a href="https://www.facebook.com/live/create">https://www.facebook.com/live/create</a>.

Click Create Live Stream.

Choose where you want to post your live broadcast.

Select **Use a persistent stream key** if you want your stream key to be permanent. If this isn't selected, you won't be able to use this stream key again after the stream ends.

Copy and paste the server URL and stream key or persistent stream key into the settings of your streaming software and start the video stream from your encoder. A preview screen will appear.

Write a description and title for your live stream.

Click **Go Live.** If you want to schedule your broadcast for later, click Schedule.

If you're live streaming to your timeline, you'll be able to choose your audience. When you end your live stream, it will stay where you shared it as a video post.





Tap in the top left of the screen or swipe right from anywhere in Feed.

Tap **Live** at the bottom of the screen, then tap 💽

The number of viewers appears at the top of the screen and comments appear at the bottom. Tap Comment to add a comment, and tap a comment and tap Pin Comment to pin it so that viewers can see it more easily.

If you're on an iOS device, you can tap in the bottom right to add photos and videos from your camera roll to your live video. When you're done, tap **End** in the top right then tap to confirm. From there, you can tap **L** in the top left to save it to your camera roll, or share it to your story.

- Keep in mind that when you save your live video to your camera roll, only the video is saved, and not things like comments, likes and viewers.



### Youtube

#### **How to Start:**

Create a YouTube account if you haven't already

Head to the <u>YouTube Studio dashboard</u>. Next, click the **camera icon** located in the top right corner. After that, click **Go Live** in the small drop-down menu.

Select **Stream** on the toolbar. A form appears to enter the stream's name, set its privacy mode, its description, and category. Be sure to select an age limit (if any) and then click **Create Stream** to continue.

Click the **Start Streaming** button.

When you're done streaming, click **End Stream** at the bottom.

- You can't stream live on YouTube until you verify the account with a linked mobile number.
- All streams under 12 hours will be automatically archived. You can access previous, current, and upcoming streams in the Live Tab.





**Swipe left** from the home timeline or tap from the composer.

Tap the **live mode** at the bottom selector.

To go live with audio but not video, tap the microphone at the top right. This will turn off the camera, and you'll be heard by viewers, but not seen.

Fill in an optional description that will appear as a Tweet, and a location if desired. Then press **Go live**.

Your live broadcast, with description and location (if added), will appear in a Tweet in your follower's timeline and on your profile.

You can end a live video at any time by pressing the **Stop button** on the top left and confirming your action in the menu that comes up.





Generate a call link in one simple <u>click</u>.

Share the link and Invite anyone even if they're not on Skype.

Join call through your unique link.

To finish the call, click the red button.





In the Zoom client, click Meetings.

Under the Upcoming tab, select the meeting you want to start. Additional options will appear.

Click **Start**.

Select a person from the Hangouts list or search for their name or email address. When you find the person you want, click their name. You can also check multiple people to start a group video call.

Click Video call.

When you're done, click **End call** .



Video calls can include up to 25 people.


